2. Safety & Maintenance Instructions

- Use only correctly rated PSUs supplied with the device.

Disk Installation

Your recorder will normally be specified and provided with the required HDD storage. However, if adding your own, (max 2 x SATA), please refer to the below section.

Preparation



You will require a 1# or 2# Philips screwdriver and antistatic gloves or wrist strap.

- Disconnect power before installation.
- Remove top cover by removing all rear and side screws and lifting cover away.



- 2. Install HDD into one of the bays provided in the bottom of the chassis and fix with screws as indicated.
- Connect both a data cable and power cable between the HDD and motherboard 1pair provided as standard.
- 4. Refit the cover and secure the cover.

This completes this part of the procedure. Format the new HDDs once logged into the recorder.

6. Connecting Devices

Place NVR into required location and use the below to identify and connect monitor, mouse, Ethernet, IP cameras and other required devices to their relevant ports.



7. Initial Start-up

Ensure all cables are connected correctly and securely.

1. Connect external PSU adaptor and switch on at wall and rear of Viper recorder. Below boot sequence will start.

NOTE: Sequence takes longer if new HDDs just installed.



- 2. Initial login screen is presented, login with admin/admin.
- 3. You will be prompted on this first login to set a new Admin password (right).

Set a strong password for maximum security!

- 4. Now login using the new password.

8. Installation Wizard Setup

It is strongly suggested you create separate and additional login accounts for users and supervisors rather than using the Admin ID.

1. Click the virtual keyboard icon to set a user ID and password.

- 2. Select Remote Access to allow web interface access to the NVR.
- 3. Click [Next] and complete any additional settings required.

Password Recovery

The password recovery procedure applies to the Admin ID only. For all other forgotten passwords, reset them by asking your local Admin account user.

1. On clicking [Forgot Password] from the previous page, the below screen will be displayed.

- 2. Make a note of the MAC address given.
- 3. Contact Vista Technical Support (number provided on page 3.) with your e-mail

address and other contact details as well as the MAC address.

- 4. Vista Technical Support respond with an e-mail and recovery file attached.
- 5. Save the recovery file to a USB memory stick, insert into the recorder and use the same menu to [Choose File] and then click [Upload].
- 6. Once recovery has occurred, log in to the recorder as Admin and set a new strong password.

Note: Password recovery e-mail replies may take up to 24-hours during busy periods!

- 1. Select system language.
- 2. Enter a device name.
- 3. Keyboard ID: Enter a unique ID for the recorder on your site for keyboard control.
- 4. HDMI: Set resolution of monitor connected to the recorder.

Note

- VGA port will not display video if resolution set to 3840x2160!
- HDMi resolution returns to 1024x768 if 3840x2160 is not supported by your monitor.

Click [Save] then [Next] to set further menu options.

NETWORK

Use below screen example and set required static or DHCP IP setting for the WAN port. Also set a static IP address, if the default is not suitable, for the PoE Port Server interface for use with any PoE port connected IP cameras.

- WAN Port: Select whether to use static IP or dynamic IP.
- IP Address, Subnet Mask, Gateway, DNS, and Port: set as required.
- PoE Ports Server: amend the default IP address if not suitable.
- 1. Click [Save] to set value.
- 2. Click [Next] to end Network settings and move to next screen.

DATE AND TIME

1. Set each item in Time/Date setting screen.



- Network Time Sync: Select to synchronize with NTP time server.
- System Time: Or set time and date manually if NTP not possible.
- DST: enable if wanting Daylight saving.
- Time Zone: Select your time zone.
- DST Start/End: Amend if incorrect for your location.
- 2. Click [Save] to set value.
- 3. Click [Next] to end Time/Date setting and go to next screen.

EASY INSTALL WIZARD

- Select whether to run Installation Wizard each time the system is started, or not.
- 2. Click [Save] to set value and complete the Installation Wizard.

Below we provide some initial basic recorder operation help.

Menu and Screen Navigation

The main live screen is shown below with various menus identified. Refer to proceeding descriptions to understand each menus navigation and explanation of options.



No.	Name	Function
1	Setup Menu	Top level menu access navigation bar.
2	Live Screen	Shows Live cameras. Also, playback when in playback operations.
3	Launcher Menu	Change split screen modes, scroll to next split screen, calendar search and export footage etc.
4	Quick Menu	Right-click mouse to reveal quick menu for more common commands and PTZ camera control.
5	Add to CH	Move mouse cursor to channel and click + icon to go to IP Camera Registration menu to add new IP camera.

Setup Menu

This section covers the Setup menu displayed at the top of the Live screen.



Note: Also available via Quick Menu when you right-click the mouse.

No.	Item	Description
1	SYSTEM	Firmware upgrade, config backup, date/time user accounts etc.
2	CAMERA	Titles, covert, audio enable, color/brightness/contrast, privacy mask, resolution etc.
3	DEVICE	HDMi/VGA resolution, spot monitor, HDD info/format, PTZ protocols, etc.
4	RECORD	Set schedule continuous/motion/alarm, main/secondary resolution etc.
5	EVENT	Set alarm, motion, video-loss and HDD notifications and parameters etc.
6	NETWORK	Set network IP details, remote black/white IP access lists, DVRNS/DDNS/P2P remote access, e-mail etc.

Live Screen and Camera Navigation Each individual camera channel in the live screen displays icons to show that individual channels status and/or function. Refer to the example and icon explanation over the page.

Quick Menu

This section details the Quick Menu that is viewed when right clicking the mouse in the Live screen.

1	Screen Mode	Select split mode: Full, 2X2, 3X3, or 4x4.
2	Fisheye	Select for 360 cameras to dewarp their views
3	Zoom in	Zoom in selected live screen, 2x, 4x or 8x.
4	Freeze	Pauses selected live video screen
5	Speaker Output/Mute	Turning on/off output sound.
6	PTZ Control	Control PTZ functions of selected camera.
7	Stop Alarm	Stop monitoring alarm output and event.
8	Text Overlay	POS Text display (future development)
9	Playback	Instantly rewind and playback selected live images (30 sec, 1 min, 5 min, 10 min, 30 min, 1-hour, go to oldest recording, return to latest record time).
10	Search	Searching recorded footage (time, event, thumbnail, smart search and text).
11	Backup	Export/backup video footage.
12	Setup	Open main set up menu.
13	Warp	Dewarp 360 camera views
14	Camera registration	Open pop-up menu for IP camera registration and addition.
15	Camera Upgrade	Open pop-up menu for IP camera firmware upgrade
16	Status	Open pop-up status menu: device system log, event, and recording status (system log, event, and record).
17	Statistical Analysis	Open pop-up menu for camera events that have occurred
18	Log in/Log out	Log in/Log out
19	Shutdown	Shuts down or restarts the recorder (shutdown, restart).

Add IP Camera Registration

The below IP Camera Registration menu is displayed when right clicking a spare channel in the Live screen and clicking + to add a new IP camera.

Note: the IP camera will first need to be physically connected to either a spare PoE port or WAN network. The camera must be set with the require DHCP or static IP address – whichever is relevant to your installation.
